



Cub & Webelos Scout Summer Resident Camp 2005

Passport to Adventure -- A Celebration in Time

Cub Scout Resident Camp for Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts is July 22-24, 2005 for 3 days / 2 nights. This session is for boys who will enter the 2nd and 3rd grades in Fall 2005. Each boy must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Webelos Resident Camp for Webelos Scouts is July 28-31 for 4 days / 3 nights. This session is for boys entering the 4th and 5th grades in Fall 2005. Webelos Scouts are required to have one adult for every four boys.

Resident Camp will be the highlight of the summer for the Scout and his parent/leader, providing the thrill of Scout camping for several days and allowing the den and pack to continue to grow together. They will wander the hills and valleys of camp, stay in two person tents on platforms and eat meals in the camp's dining hall.

Webelos should plan to attend camp as a group. Registration will be by pack or den only. Fill in the registration form included in this packet and return it with your fee to your Cubmaster or Den Leader. Your leader will mail it to the Council Service Center along with the pack registration form.

Tigers, Wolves and Bears can register individually by mailing or bringing the registration form and fee back to the Council Service Center.

Registration is on a FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED BASIS WITH PAYMENT. Space will be limited to 150 Scouts per session.



PARENT ORIENTATION MEETING (Required)

The orientation meeting for Leaders and adults coming to camp will be held at 7:00 p.m. at the Great Smoky Mountain Council offices on the Tuesday before your camp session starts – Cub Resident Camp Meeting July 12th and Webelos Resident Camp July 19th.

LEADERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Cub Resident Camp requires each boy to be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Webelos Resident Camp requires at least one adult for every four boys. All adults leaders in camp should be familiar with the BSA's youth protection policies.

REQUIRED HEALTH FORMS

Every adult and youth camper must have a completed Class 1 and Class 2 Personal Health and Medical Summary Form. The Health Department requires immunization dates and parent signatures on all health forms. Adults over 40 ARE REQUIRED to have a Class 3 Personal Health and Medical Summary Form which requires a doctor's exam.

FEES

Cub Scout Resident Camp \$60.00 / boys entering 2nd or 3rd grade in the fall
(includes meals, camp t-shirt, patch, program supplies and insurance)

Adults \$40

(includes meals, camp t-shirt and patch, insurance)

Webelos Resident Camp \$85.00 / boys entering 4th or 5th grade in the fall
(includes meals, camp t-shirt, patch, program supplies and insurance)

Adults \$40

(includes meals, camp t-shirt and patch, insurance)

EARLY REGISTRATION

Scouts registering by July 1st will receive a special Early Bird patch and qualify for the Early Bird registration of \$50 for Wolf/Bear Camp or \$70 for Webelos Camp.

REGISTRATION

Fees are due in total with your application and are non-refundable after July 1st.

POLICY FOR TRANSFERRING FEES

Supplies are purchased for Camp based on pre-registration totals. Registration fees are not refundable after July 1st, but may be transferred to another Scout who has not yet paid the registration fee. All requests to transfer a registration fee must be made in writing prior to a Pack's arrival at camp.



CAMPERSHIPS

Don't let financial hardship keep your son from attending Camp.

The Council has scholarship funds available to assist needy Scouts in attending camp. The responsibility to make Camp available to every Scout is shared between the parents, the Pack leadership and the Council. It is the policy of the Council that a full campership will not be granted to any individual Scout.

Parents and Pack leaders should discuss the level of assistance needed and submit a request for assistance to the Council Office. The GSMC Camping Committee will award camperships based on the amount of dollars available and demonstrated need.

Campership forms are available from the Council office. In order for Campership forms to be considered, the forms must be turned in at the Council Service Center by June 15, 2005.
